WEDNESDAY, JUNE 25 PRE-TOUR - "A Day in Milledgeville — Georgia's Civil War Capital"

This pre-convention day tour will take you to Georgia's antebellum capital of Milledgeville. Upon arrival, we will tour the Old Governor's Mansion and Old State Capital, visiting the room where the Articles of Session withdrew Georgia from the Union. Time will then be allotted to stroll through the downtown area for lunch (on your own) and shopping. It will then be time to enjoy the Milledgeville's Trolley Tour, which is the best way to see the landmark historic district and the city's impressive architecture. Following this brief "Old South" experience, you will return to Atlanta, the modern day capital of Georgia.

THURSDAY, JUNE 26 - "Atlanta Motor Speedway" (lunch included)

The Atlanta Motor Speedway is one of the premier motorsports facilities in the country. The morning outing will include the Official <u>Track Tour</u>, which includes a brief track history, a visit to <u>Petty Garden</u>, a sneak peek at the garages and <u>Victory Lane</u>, and two laps in the Speedway Van around the same 1.54-mile track that stars like Jeff Gordon and Dale Earnhardt, Jr. have raced. The tour concludes with a stop at one of the south's fine BBQ restaurants for an included lunch.

THURSDAY, JUNE 26 - "Stone Mountain Laser Light Show - Spectacular" (dinner included)

Our evening out takes us to Stone Mountain, Georgia's most popular attraction. The largest high relief sculpture in the world, the Confederate Memorial Carving, depicts three Confederate heroes of the Civil War, President Jefferson Davis and Generals Robert E. Lee and Thomas J. "Stonewall" Jackson. We will have an included dinner on the terrace and stay to watch the unique laser show "Spectacular", featuring a fantastic live fireworks finale, transforming the park into a natural amphitheater. This will definitely be a night out to remember!

FRIDAY, JUNE 27 - "Gone with the Wind" (Option 1 - 1/2 day tour - lunch included)

Step back in time with the sights and sounds of Atlanta during the Civil War and Reconstruction with this visit to the Marietta Gone with the Wind Museum featuring hundreds of artifacts and pieces of memorabilia. Then, we will visit the Margaret Mitchell House where most of Gone with the Wind was penned, complete with Mitchell's writing desk. Lunch is included with the tour.

FRIDAY, JUNE 27 - "CNN Center" (Option 2 - 1/2 day tour - lunch included)

The world famous CNN Center, global headquarters of CNN and Turner Broadcasting, is located in the heart of downtown Atlanta. The Studio Tour includes the one-of-a-kind re-creation of the main control room, where you can see and hear the behind-the-scenes elements of 24-hour news. Test your knowledge with the journalism ethics display, and learn how images are made. A boxed lunch is included from Atlanta's own Chick-fil-A.


