Centennial 1921-2021 Convention ~ Pre and Post Tour Previews

The 2021 National Convention begins on Monday, June 28 with the Pre Tour offered prior to the opening of the First General Assembly and Welcome Reception.

- ♦ The Pre Tour will take you to a place that is nestled in the open prairie of northeast Oklahoma. You will find the pace is a little slower, the people are friendlier and the food is out of this world in part thanks to Food Network TV star and Osage County resident Ree Drummond, a.k.a. **The Pioneer Woman**.
- ♦ Come along on a tour of some of the area's top museums, historic sites, shopping, dining and more as you walk in the footsteps of Ree Drummond. Discover what this little slice of heaven is all about!
- ♦ Immaculate Conception Catholic Church...known for its rare stained glass windows. This 1910 French Gothic-style Catholic church was the principal church of the Osage Tribe. Now, known as the the Immaculate Conception Church, the **Cathedral of the Osage** in Pawhuska features 22 stained glass windows that visitors can admire. Hear the story of the windows' creation while taking in the beauty of each individual pane.

- ◆ **Osage County Historical Society Museum** is housed in an old Santa Fe depot. This museum features western life, pioneer life, early day oil industry, Native American life, and Boy Scout displays. Pawhuska was home to the first organized, uniformed Boy Scouts troop in America, chartered in 1909 by a missionary sent from the Church of England.
- ◆ **The Pioneer Woman Mercantile** is where shopping and food is at the heart of The Pioneer Woman! Enjoy time browsing Ree Drummond's beloved restaurant, bakery, and boutique in the heart of Pawhuska, followed by a scrumptious lunch at the Merc Event Center.
- ◆ **Roaming the Osage Scenic Guided Tour** while in Pawhuska and the surrounding area while enjoying views of the Osage Hills and Tallgrass Prairie with a local guide as we make way to the Drummond Ranch. Discover the little town with a "BIG HISTORY!"
- ◆ A possible trip to **The Lodge on Drummond Ranch**. The Lodge is the family guest house, which also serves as the production location for The Pioneer Woman's Food Network show!

Day 1 Cherokee Heritage, Friday, July 2nd

Tahlequah, the capital of the Cherokee Nation, contains a variety of hidden gems for you to discover! The Cherokee people were forced from their homes in 1836 starting what many would call "The Trail of Tears". The Cherokee were relocated to Oklahoma along with hundreds of other indigenous tribes. Enjoy views along the scenic Illinois River as we make our way to Tahlequah, to revisit history. Fall in love with shops, restaurants, museums and trails.

- ◆ **Cherokee Heritage Center** - Step back in time and experience the full richness with living history interpreters. Within the rock walls are a permanent Trail of Tears exhibit, along with other revolving history exhibits, plus the popular Cherokee Family Research Center. Learn the Cherokee style of **basket weaving** and purchase your own handcrafted basket.
- ◆ **Hunter's Home** - tour the only remaining pre-Civil War plantation home in Oklahoma.
- ◆ **Restaurant and Gift Shop of the Cherokees** - You will be welcomed with O-SI-YO (Hello) and enjoy a Cherokee style lunch. The Gift Shop features authentic Native American jewelry and art.
- ◆ **Cherokee National Prison, National Supreme Court & National History Museums**
- ◆ **Return to Hard Rock at 5pm**

Day 2 Bentonville, Saturday, July 3rd

There is no place that is unquestionably unique and strangely familiar. A place filled with culture and a strong sense of community, brimming with artistic and natural beauty. Explore with all of your senses; from fresh air in the Ozarks, to fresh cuisine on your plate. Bentonville, Arkansas...a town to visit, to see, to breathe, and to discover!

- ◆ **Walmart Museum** - The original location of the Walton's 5 & 10, launched by Sam Walton in 1950.
- ◆ **Shopping Downtown Bentonville**
- ◆ **Peel Mansion Museum and Heritage Gardens and Lunch** - Travel to a log cabin, to an Italian Mansion, and finally to the Heritage Gardens and enjoy lunch while taking in the fresh air of the Ozarks!
- ◆ **Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art** - Nestled in 120 acres of Ozark woods with miles of trails. Stroll through the permanent collection. Some of the best-known names in American art have works on display; Gilbert Stuart's George Washington, Asher B. Durand's Kindred Spirits, and Norman Rockwell's Rosie the Riveter.

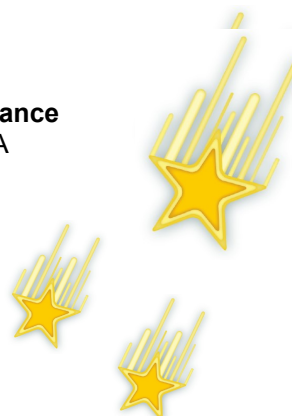
