Engaging Families ~ By Dr. Melissa Frans, Xi Chapter, Iota State/NE

Family engagement is a hot topic in education. All over the country, schools are writing strategies and implementing plans to improve their family engagement practices. During the 2017-2018 year, I was given the opportunity to research and then write, *Family Engagement: Finding Parents' Perspectives*. The following is the definition my research yield for family engagement:

**Family engagement happens both at school and at home. Strong partnerships
Between families and schools form when a strong school community is prevalent
And open, reciprocal communication is established, and the whole child is developed.
Parents should be valued as the primary educators of their children and their ideas should
Be valued as the primary educators of their children and their ideas should be invited and
Welcome in schools, and the importance of education should be supported at home. (Frans, 2018)**

One of the best indicators of student success is a supportive family. As educators, we want to empower families to lead their children to success. If a family asks you, "How can I help my child achieve his/her goals?", you can respond by saying:

Make learning important in your home.

- Designate a quiet, study or reading time at home.
- Ask your child what he/she is learning at school.
- Make sure your child is getting enough sleep.
- Have conversations about interesting topics.
- Read together.
- Attend open house, special events, parent/teacher conferences, and band/choir concerts.
- Communicate with the school when your child is going to be absent, is struggling, and has questions.

With these strategies, there is a higher indication of family engagement, and, therefore, student success!
