

Kappas never cease to amaze me! Amid a world-wide pandemic, Kappas put their creative energies to work and sought creative and innovative ways to continue the business of our beloved organization. Since our last meeting at Headquarters – March 2020 Audit/Business/NEC meeting, the National Executive Committee (NEC) has met for a total of six NEC Zoom meetings (June 26, July 1, July 8, October 1, October 15, and December 3.) From these meetings we have updated the Housekeeping Contract and Responsibilities When Using Headquarter Facilities

Contract. We voted to have Christina Oliver update and secure our National Kappa Kappa lota Website. Christina will begin this process January 2021. The Catastrophic Emergency Plan, chaired by Immediate Past National President Chris Hockert is nearing completion. The Grant Writing Committee prepared and submitted eleven grants for technology and growth. *Virtual Koffee Break*, a time of fellowship between the NEC and current State Presidents (SP) begins January 21st with Henrietta Hamilton/CA hosting. The purpose of these monthly virtual meetings is to help our SPs feel more connected to our NEC and National Headquarters. Our *Kappa Spotlight* continues to highlight many of our Kappas making a difference in the name of Kappa Kappa lota. Debbie Witt/AR is rejoicing because we have a new membership pin and preorders are being taken.

In November I visited with Tau Chapter of Lambda State/GA for their regular meeting on Zoom. They graciously invited me to their Lambda State Zoom Christmas Party in December, complete with Bingo and an *Ugly Christmas Sweater* contest. Kappa member Ken Russell led us in singing Christmas carols. My Contact States include: Mississippi, New Mexico, Tennessee, Kansas, Kentucky, and Oklahoma. Consider setting up a ZOOM Meeting. I am happy to help you with this if you would like for me to join you in a meeting.

I received seventeen out of twenty-two SP Mid-Year Reports. These reports indicate that many of our chapters continue to struggle with meeting due to the Pandemic while some chapters are hosting their Kappa meetings through ZOOM. State activities reported included: orientation meeting, chili dinner/art show/ prospective members, Zoom Meetings, Teleconference, Instagram, Facebook Page, Gmail accounts, phone, Email, and Virtual Honors Day to present scholarships, drawings for free membership, and giving of classroom grants. Suggestions for improvements included: concern that national information needs to be passed from our SPs to our Chapter Presidents, and Zoom is a foreign language for some. It was suggested having a specific form and packet to be given to new members and chapters, and suggestions were made for the scholarship committee to consider.

Currently, the NEC is preparing for our Audit/Business/NEC Meeting in March. We have planned what that will look like if COVID continues to be an issue. It is each of our desires to be at Kappa Headquarters. Kappa business will continue to be addressed regardless of what the March meeting looks like.

In closing I want to call attention to our *Code of Ethics*. This code has great meaning for me. It specifically reminds me what I as a representative of Kappa should strive for: courtesy, friendliness, promptness, trust, understanding, high moral behavior, honoring the reputation and welfare of our fellow Kappas, working to bring strength and promotion to the purposes of Kappa, listening attentively, acting constructively, keeping an open mind, and continuing to serve Kappa in an honorable manner.
