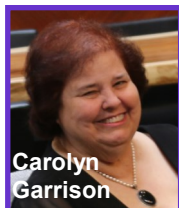

I never met the friend, but am happy that Gail thought we favored, so much that she approached me to share that with me. That led to a long and warm friendship. She gave me a tiny little blue bird of happiness at the first National Convention where we met. Every year after that, I looked forward to Convention and seeing Gail Joiner. When I was National President-Elect, I received a phone call from Gail. She wanted to know what size dress I wore.
