
State President Susan Allred, Rho State/North Carolina

She must add a certification in this area. As the single parent of a special needs son, her finances are stretched thin.

Tami Martyn is from Weatherford, Oklahoma and is currently a Science Teacher at Taloga Public Schools. She holds a Bachelor's of Science in Biochemistry, a Master's of Science in Chemistry, and a Doctorate of Science in Chemistry from the University of Oklahoma. She is currently pursuing graduate level courses to complete her teaching certification. She will be attending Southwestern University in Weatherford to complete the Classroom Management and Teaching Pedagogy graduate-level courses during the summer of 2022. These are the only required courses for her to complete her teaching certification so she can continue to serve the rural community of Taloga, OK. She is pursuing this course work to ensure that she has the knowledge she requires to serve a student population she is less familiar with. She has worked with undergraduate and graduate students for about 20 years but is still a first year teacher at the K-12 level.

Taylor Lloyd is from Soddy Daisy, Tennessee and is currently a high school senior. Her grandmother was a teacher and Taylor helped her one year which planted the desire in her to become a teacher. Her experience taught her that elementary school teachers have the biggest impact on students. They help build character and moral in students to know right from wrong. Taylor will start at the University of Montevallo in Alabama on August 19, 2022

Kallie Cox is a teacher's assitant in an afterschool program and a Junior at Northeastern State University. She will be taking her Pre-II Internship in the Spring of 2023. Prior to this intership, she intends to take the Oklahoma Subject area test for Middle Level Science, the Oklahoma Subject Area Test for Middle level Social Studies, and the Oklahoma Subject Area Test for Elementary Education. During her final semester at Northeastern State in the Fall of 2023 she will be completing her Final Internship and the Praxis Performerance Assessment of Teachers. Kallie will be using the scholarship monies to help pay for these tests as they are paid by the student and not included in the price of tuition.

Annah Heck is currently attending the Concordia University in Seward, NE pursing a Bachelor's of Science in Psychology. She has been accepted into the University's BA to MA program and anticipates that she will earn her master degree in a year to a year and a half after completing her undergraduate program. She will be interning with a school counselor at St. John Elementary School staring in August of 2022. Her grandmother, a former State President of Kappa Kappa lota, introduced her to this scholarship when she learned of her desire to become a school counselor. Annah believes it is important to be connected with organizations that support those in the education field and Annah appreciates that Kappa Kappa lota supports those striving to join the educational profession. Faith has been an instrumental aspect of her education and she hopes to be able to show the love of Christ to the kids that she works with.
