Proposed Bylaw Change (#2- #1 appeared in the Holiday Profile)

Article VI - Officers

Section 3 - Election of National Officers

D (page 9) Currently reads:

The officers shall be elected by ballot by the certified delegates at the National Convention, except where there is only one nominee for an office, and then the election shall be by voice vote.

Add, at the end, after the word vote, "*except when a certified delegate moves for a paper ballot.*"

Reasoning: (*Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised: in Brief 2020 - page 74*)

4. Ballot Vote

Ballots are typically used in elections and may also be used for other important decisions when there is a desire to keep secret how each member votes. A motion may be made to conduct a ballot vote. You may say, "I move that the vote be taken by ballot."

Proposed new bylaw would now read:

D. The officers shall be elected by ballot by the certified delegates at the National Convention, except where there is only one nominee for an office, and then the election shall be by voice vote; except when a certified delegate moves for a paper ballot.

Welcome First Time Convention Attendees!

Welcome to your first Kappa Kappa Iota Convention! As a newcomer, navigating this enriching experience can be quite exciting. First, plan to complete the 2026 National Convention Registration form and mail it to Lynn McNeilly by May 1, 2025. Next, reserve your room at the Sheraton Airport in Charlotte, the official convention hotel. It's fun to share a room so be sure to check with your local and state Kappas to find a roommate. You can also go on the National Kappa Facebook page to reach out to others if you need help finding a roommate.

To decide what to register for, review the conference schedule on page 8 for an overview of the events of the convention. 
